YOUTH CENTRE BUILDING UPDATE

The big news for Just42 in the last few months has been the closing and demolition of the youth centre which served as our base for 10 years.



Caroline, our charity manager said: "We were struggling to find suitable office space in Woodbridge that we could afford, but we felt it was key to stay in Woodbridge as we've built up a network of volunteers and

contact with young people here."

After a tense few weeks of searching for office space in Woodbridge, and finding out just how expensive working in this lovely place is, we were really grateful that 3 of our local Councillors offered to help us buy a newly refurbished cabin to use as a main base and office using their Suffolk Coastal Enabling Communities Budget.



Cllr Geoff Holdcroft said, on behalf of the Councillors who provided the funding, "We wanted to join together to support the local charity because their work has a positive impact not

only on the young people it supports but also the wider community. Just42 is a valuable resource for young people in this area by giving them support and guidance as well as helping them develop into later life. We hope by securing this new office space they can concentrate on the work they do so well."

Now a group led by County Councillor Caroline Page has formed, who are looking at the possibility of rebuilding a community space at the site of the old youth centre. Suffolk County Council has said that a viable business plan needs to be presented to them by the end of the year for them to consider. There is still lots of work to do, but hopefully SCC will accept the plan and make the land available to the project on a long term lease basis. In April we got official confirmation that our nomination to list the land as a Community Asset, where the youth centre was situated, was successful so this is a promising start. JUST42'S YOUTH WORK APPRENTICE

Our apprentice journey began when someone from the Apprenticeships Suffolk Business Service cold called the office in October 2015. Just42 were really pleased to join a campaign in Suffolk to help generate 500 more apprenticeships. So the search began and Milly joined us January 2016. Milly started working in 3 of our youth clubs as the session worker and also at one of our sports coaching sessions. Alongside her work at Just42 she is studying for her Children & Young People's workforce advanced apprenticeship with West Suffolk College. She has got involved in schools work at Farlingaye High School and also at our holiday clubs.

COMPASS MENTORING

One of our core offerings at Just42 is Compass Mentoring. We offer a mentoring service to young people aged 11-18 working closely with Kesgrave and Farlingaye High Schools.

WHAT DOES MENTORING INVOLVE?

Many young people struggle with everyday issues or may have mild mental health problems. Our mentoring service provides an outlet for young people to talk to someone other than their family and friends, about issues they may be struggling with. A lot of our young people really appreciate having someone to talk to, who is not close to them that they trust and can confide in.

HOW MANY PEOPLE DO WE PROVIDE MENTORING FOR?

During the period 16/17 we provided 358 1 to 1 sessions, providing mentoring sessions for 33 males and 21 females. The main issues covered were: Anxiety, family, self-esteem and mental health. The average number of sessions we provide per week is 15.

WHO HEADS UP OUR MENTORING CO-ORDINATION?

Kevin Woods is our compass mentoring coordinator. He leads mentoring training sessions for our volunteers and is the main point of contact for our schools. He provides pastoral support for mentors and oversees the ongoing mentoring relationships. Kevin works closely with local schools. Here are some of the comments teachers have made about our mentoring services:

'From my experience you offer a professional and caring service to a wide range of students'

'The work you've done with students in my year group has been very beneficial and we've seen some very pleasing improvements in attendance and behaviour'

YOUTH CLUB NEWS

Over the last year we have introduced a theme for each term for all the youth clubs to follow, which helps with planning, resources and efficiency. The whole team plan and brainstorm ideas together, then Jacqui and Milly prepare resources for each club so that it is all ready for our session workers to use when they arrive to run the clubs. This term they are looking at Well-being and Healthy lifestyles, so each week there has been a different fruit for the young people to try - so far they have tried fresh pineapple, kiwis and dates and we have also offered smoothies and other food options in place of our usual tuck shops to encourage the young people to eat more healthily.



The young people have tried to work out the amount of sugar in popular drinks and sweets and later in the term they will be discussing drugs, alcohol (this will include the young people trying out the beer goggles which is always fun to watch!) sex and relationships, smoking, sleep, skin and hair care. They are also planning some different physical activities to do each week to get the young people to try different and fun forms of exercise.
